

Current and future plans

- Declaration of Emergency by NM Governor – March 11, 2020 and COVID-19 Emergency Declaration Resolution Number M70-2020-PO37 issued by the Zuni Governor and Tribal Council on March 19, 2020.
- Stay at home order date was issued on March 23, 2020 and revised to extend to April 30th on April 6th by NM Governor.
- Governor and Tribal Council discourages community members from traveling from out of the community.
- Zuni is closed to the traveling public. Travelers/Tourists/non-community members are discouraged from stopping in Zuni, and this messaging is shared by Governor Lujan-Grisham throughout the state of New Mexico. - Statement issued by Zuni Governor on April 1, 2020
- All tribal lakes are closed
- Notification of closure

Partial Closure

By order from the Governor - To mitigate the spread of the Covid-19 virus, limit time of entrance and exit into the Zuni Community between the hours of 5:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

1. Zuni Police/Tribal Rangers will establish designated checkpoints to inform the traveling public.
2. Community members allowed to leave and enter the Zuni community between the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. to conduct essential business.

“It is highly recommended that children and Elders stay home when essential business must be done!”

3. Tribal members coming from out of state instructed to self-quarantine.

4. All fishing lakes on the Zuni Reservation are closed to the public

5. Notification: Closure of the village is forth coming. Please visit Pueblo of Zuni Media pages and information boards.

Closure Enforcement:

By Order of the Governor (Declaration) – Pending

To mitigate the spread of the Covid-19 virus, closure of the Zuni Community to non-tribal members with a 24-hour checkpoint.

1. Zuni Police/Tribal Rangers will establish designated checkpoints to enforce the following.

Criteria

Leaving the Reservation:

- Only two Community members per vehicle allowed to leave the reservation between the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. to conduct essential business. Restrictions on elderly and children emphasized.

- Travelers/ Non-tribal members allowed to leave.

Coming into the Reservation:

- Travelers will not be allowed onto the reservation and can be diverted to North highway 602, east highway 53 or south highway 36.

- Tribal members will be allowed access into community – State ID with Address/Census card/Work ID

Essential Non-tribal members who reside outside of the Zuni community and employed within the Zuni community allowed with proper work identification.

Non-tribal members residing with Tribal Members provided access with verification.

Non-tribal members who reside in the Zuni community and employed within the Zuni community allowed in with proper work identification.

Non-Tribal members requesting entrance for medical care. Provide copy of declaration of closure outlining restrictions from entering the community for goods and services.
